### Summary of Project

One World Garden was created to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Scouting movement worldwide. "One World, One promise" captured the hopes and dreams of young people around the world and the garden is a series of "outdoor rooms" reflecting a child's journey through life.

The dry stone walling, discovery dell and the calm pool (a half dome niche) make up a significant part of the garden. Over 25% of the garden is dry stone walls. The half domed niche was built using a wooden former blind. The craftsmen had to work from behind, hand picking and placing each stone to create the cave-like structure.
