Published by DSWA . Author R Tufnell. Softback 16 pages, 11 line drawings.
Written as a beginner's guide, this popular publication gives basic information on construction of dry stone walls (double-style).

Dry Stone Walling – Techniques And Traditions ISBN 0 9512306 8 9
Published by DSWA. *A practical guide to the building techniques used in different parts of the country. Drawings and photographs illustrate the various walls types and features and show the place of walls in Britain's history, its landscape and its future.*

Dry Stone Walling ISBN 0 9502623 0 7
Published by SW Scotland Branch. Reprinted 1999. Author: Col F Rainsford Hannay. Softback 109 pages, 33 black & white pictures or drawings. *First published in 1957, written at a time when there was a definite waning of interest in the craft. It has stood the test of time and provides a valuable insight into the history and construction of dry stone walls around the country - and beyond.*

Revised by Elizabeth Agate with Sean Adcock 1999. Softback, spiral binding with soft cover.
A practical book including history, construction, conservation and legal aspects of dry stone walls.

Published by DSWA in 2018. Author: Ann Perrin. *A6 softback (postcard size) containing a poem and illustrations designed to teach pre-school children about the wildlife that abounds in a dry stone wall.*

Published by DSWA. Softback; 64 pages. Over 50 colour/mono illustrations. *The story of the Millennium Wall project bringing examples of walls together on a single site, plus information on construction, history and stone.*

Published by DSWA . Written and illustrated by David Griffiths
Softback, 104 pages, 57 illustrations. *Featuring Master Craftsman Steven Allen. This book is essential reading for everyone; with sections about competitions, building techniques, regional variations, etc all extensively illustrated. Fold out section of a set of drawings to depict competitions.*

Published by Shire. Author: Lawrence Garner. Softback, 40 pages, illustrated (colour/black & white and line drawings). *Providing basic history and brief construction information.*

Published by Shire. Author: Merfyn Williams. Softback 31 pages B&W.
Set mostly in Wales and England, this book is a most interesting overview of the British Slate industry.

Quarries & Quarrying ISBN 978 0 85263 728 9
Published by Shire. Author P Stanier. Softback 32 pages B&W.
An excellent informative book on the source of building stone in Britain.

What's On A Wall: The Ecology Of Walls ISBN 1 901676 20 X
Produced by South Court Environmental Ltd. *A useful reference guide on the variety of species of flora and fauna found on a wall. A recording form is included in the book.*

Conserving The Flora Of Limestone Dry Stone Walls
Published by Wiltshire Natural History Publications Trust. Author John Presland 2007.
This guide describes limestone walls and their flora and explains how to identify typical species. It is based on a study in West Wiltshire but will have some relevance to limestone dry stone walls throughout the country.
