Summary of Project

One World Garden was created to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Scouting movement worldwide. "One World, One promise" captured the hopes and dreams of young people around the world and the garden is a series of "outdoor rooms" reflecting a child's journey through life.

The dry stone walling, discovery dell and the calm pool (a half dome niche) make up a significant part of the garden. Over 25% of the garden is dry stone walls. The half domed niche was built using a wooden former blind. The craftsmen had to work from behind, hand picking and placing each stone to create the cave-like structure.
